TMAG is home to one of the most significant collections of Huon pine furniture in the world and this exhibition features selected items from the Museum of Old and New Art State Collection of TMAG.

You may remember the excitement in 2006 when the TMAG purchased George Burrows' Huon Pine Furniture Collection with the help of a generous \$740,000 donation from David Walsh, via his private museum MONA. Before then, TMAG only had two minor pieces of pre 1840 Huon Pine furniture. The collection now holds 58 objects, 29 of these pre 1840.

George Burrows gives regular tours of the collection, but at our function he will talk more about collecting and about amassing this glorious collection.
