
Dinosaur rEvolution: Information for School Bookings



Before visiting *Dinosaur rEvolution: Secrets of Survival* at the Tasmanian Museum and Art Gallery (TMAG) there are a few things you can do to make the most of your time:

- Remember this is a ticketed exhibition with specific times for your school group to visit. To get the most out of your visit please adhere strictly to the times indicated on your ticket.
- Due to the high volume of schools expected to attend *Dinosaur rEvolution*, we ask that you consider limiting your time at TMAG to this exhibition only. Please book your visit to other areas of TMAG at a later date.
- To make the most of your class's experience, go to the *Dinosaur rEvolution* [School Bookings page](#) on the TMAG website and download the specially created Teacher's Guide for K-6 primary students, available from Term 4 2018.
- To ensure your group and other visitors have an enjoyable experience, please talk with your students about respecting other visitors. Please ensure your group will have adequate adult supervision at all times. **We strongly recommend a ratio of five primary students per adult, as recommended by the Department of Education.**

Parking

Buses and passenger vans can drop off and pick up students in Campbell Street, outside the Hotel Grand Chancellor, or on Argyle Street, opposite the Maritime Museum. Car parking, including accessible parking, is available in the Dunn Street car park, council parking fees apply.

On Arrival

- Groups should use the main visitor entrance through the Watergate and Courtyard.
- Level access for wheelchair users is provided through the same entrance, and a limited number of wheelchairs are available to borrow free of charge.
- Student bags are not permitted within the museum and should be left on the bus if possible. Limited storage for student bags is available near the visitor information desk.
- Toilet facilities are located on the ground floor near the visitor information desk.
- A floor map can be obtained online prior to your visit or you can collect one as you enter.

Eating at TMAG

No food or drink is permitted in the galleries. There is limited seating within the Courtyard and outside the main gates for groups to use. Café seating, including the seating along the veranda is for use by café patrons only and not available for use as group seating. Mawson Place is close by and may provide a suitable alternative for larger groups.

Public Liability

Please note that the Tasmanian Museum and Art Gallery is a business unit of the Department of State Growth and as such we maintain full public liability insurance. The provision of a risk assessment is the onus of the visiting organisation and is not TMAG's responsibility.
